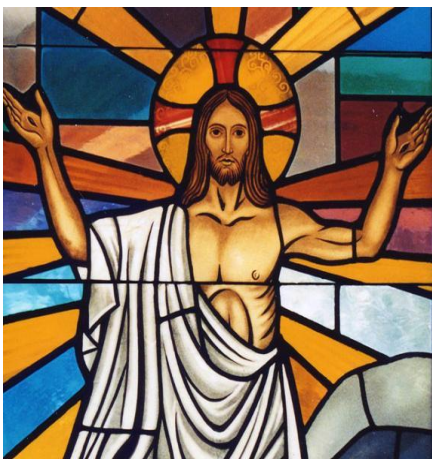

Deacons Sunday:

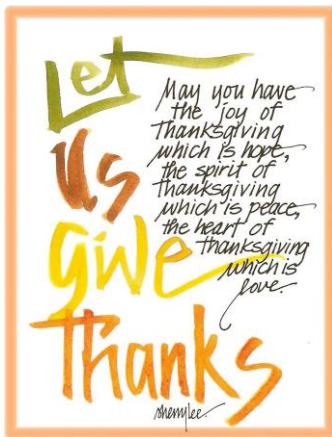
Communion Sunday, **November 5**, is a time for remembering the Deacons to support ongoing mission and care ministry.

A Snapshot of FAM Last Year:

Over 56,506 encounters with children and adults

- 11,000 unique people were reached
- Over 46% of those reached are children under 18
- 15% of people FAM reaches are seniors, a growing vulnerable population
- 92 homeless mothers and children and single women were sheltered through Gilchrist House (FAM's interim homeless shelter)
- \$2 million in food, personal care items, and clothing were redistributed to people in need
